


ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME

FROM ERASMUS TO ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME (Brief overview)




 Erasmus Programme was launched by the European Commission in 1987 with the aim to support the exchanges of students.

The programme was named after the famous Dutch philosopher Desiderius Erasmus of Rotterdam, who lived and worked in many places in Europe. At the same time, **ERASMUS** is a backronym meaning **European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students.**

Erasmus through the years

- First exchanges have been done in 1987 of just over 3000 students between 11 Member States -Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Greece, France, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain and United Kingdom
- In 1988 Luxembourg joins Erasmus programme
- In 1992 six other European countries joined the programme (Austria, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland)
- In 1999 six Central and Eastern European countries joined the programme (Bulgaria, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania and Slovenia)
- In 2004 Turkey joined Erasmus
- In January 2014 the EU launched the new Erasmus+ Programme. The name Erasmus became so
 popular that the EC decided to keep it for the next Programme that has been entitled Erasmus+
- The new programme combines all the EU's schemes for education, training, youth and sport (Leonardo da Vinci, Tempus)

Since 2014 (Programming period 2014 – 2020) the EC provides various opportunities for projects within Erasmus+ Programme on interest of the HEI's:









Start of the Programme at SU – 1999


Over 650 Inter-institutional agreements signed with partner Universities


Mobilities for traineeship to Programme countries





Learning abroad provides the participants with a wide range of	Sharing experiences and knowledge with other teachers;
